## State school enrolments

August 2019-23

- A total of 570,259 students were enrolled in Queensland state schools in August 2023.
- From 2019 to 2023, enrolments grew by 9,258 (1.7%).
- In 2023, the largest proportion of state school students were in Metropolitan South Region (22.7%), South East Region (19.5%), and Metropolitan North Region (18.2%).

- In 2023, the largest proportion of First Nations students were in Far North Queensland Region (18.8%), North Queensland Region (14.0%), and Metropolitan South Region (13.2%).
